Scripture Reflection

Today's wonderful 2nd reading should bring us such comfort. "See what love the Father has bestowed on us that we may be called children of God. Yet, so we are." So many times, we are tempted to believe that we have to earn God's love: that we have to act in a certain way in order for God to *really* love us. Worse yet, we believe that we have done something in the past that has caused us to lose God's love. God's love for us is not dependent on our behavior, for God's goodness is far larger than our flaws and sins! Because God loves us, we are God's children, and because we are God's children, God loves us. If a human parent can love his or her children, no matter what they do, then how much more can God love us? How we underestimate God and God's love; what havoc that underestimation can wreak. Let us all read...and believe... the passage from 1 John 3: 1-2. Better yet, let us memorize it, and repeat it when God seems far away.
